Dear Congregants,

On Sunday, 2/1/26, there will be a Special Meeting(Coffee Chat) after Service to vote on the Purchase Offer from Micheal Crisfulli of \$1,218,750.00 . The Congregation will vote on whether to accept this offer for our property at 624 N. Broadway.

Since our Coffee Chat on Sunday, 1/25/26, Mr. Crisfulli has modified his offer in accordance with our request. He will put down \$25,000.00 at signing of the offer. If he needs more than 60 days to complete his due diligence, he will pay us a non refundable \$25,000.00 and the original \$25k paid will become non refundable as well. The buyer hopes to close in six months. If he needs an additional three months for permits and City approval, he will pay us an additional \$25,000.00 non refundable fee for that extension.

The New Home Task Force will have financial analysis completed for your review and questions on Sunday, in regard to our new home. There is also info with a Bast Hatfield construction schedule which starts the project at 400 Loudon Road in April and completes the Building in December, 2026

It's extremely important that our members are present to participate and vote.

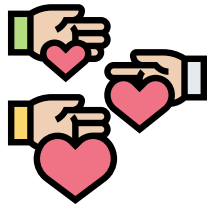

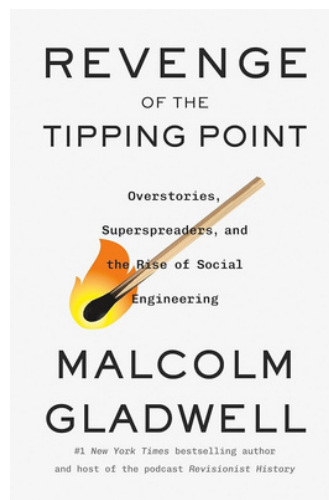
